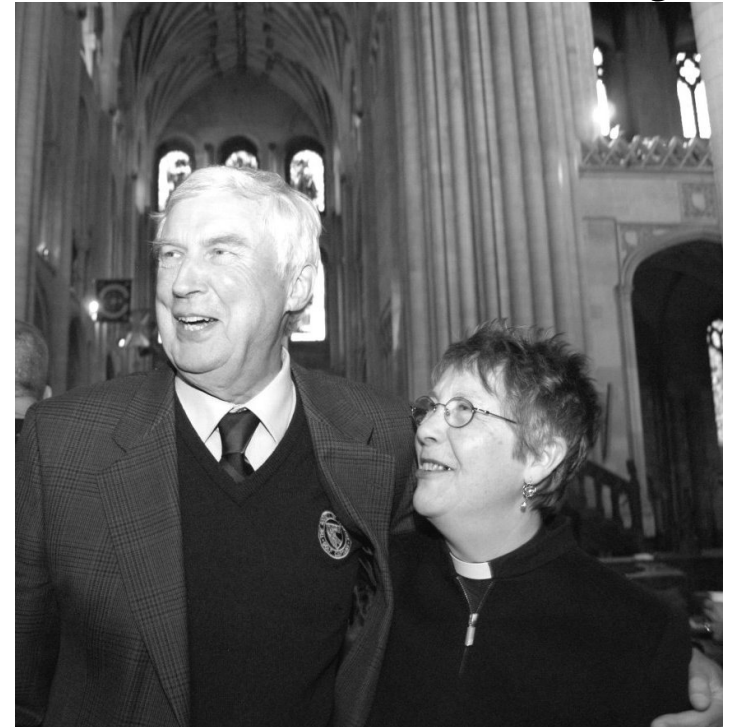


Reverend Canon Janice and Mr Ian Scott
